

### YEAR IN REVIEW



For more than 52 years, Fellowship Hall has been focused on our mission to help people who suffer from substance use disorders find the path to recovery. We offer a quality, evidence-based treatment program built on the proven foundation of a twelve-step philosophy. We work hard to ensure treatment at Fellowship Hall

is accessible to all people in a welcoming and compassionate environment.

We continued to see upward movement in the number of individuals seeking treatment in 2023 and at the same time, experienced a notable change in our leadership

team with the retirement of our CEO and President Mike Yow in June. With our adaptive group of leaders, we engaged in strategic refinements of our programs to ensure the highest standard of care for our guests, while also adding several telehealth options including a new virtual Intensive Outpatient Program, virtual Early Recovery Groups for our guests and a virtual Early Recovery Group for family members. In addition, we updated our model to a 30-day residential program while expanding our service to operate a stand-alone detox program for those not yet prepared for a full residential program.

We have a keen focus on our financial stability. Though we ended FY23 with a deficit of \$1.8M, we decreased our losses by half from FY22. With incremental adjustments to expenditures and implementation of revenue generating initiatives, we are on a positive trajectory toward financial stability for FY24. As we look ahead, our strategic vision encompasses sustained growth, innovative approaches to treatment, and an unwavering commitment to serving our community. Our Board's continued partnership is integral to realizing this vision, and I am grateful for the support of our staff and Board - both of which are pivotal to our shared commitment to enhancing the lives of those affected by substance use disorders.



## **OUTCOMES**

We offer the Continuing Care Program to help monitor the progress of our alumni after they discharge from our residential treatment program. Our Alumni Coordinator conducts check-ins beginning at one day through one year post discharge. The outcomes of our treatment program are outstanding. **OUTCOMES AT 1 YEAR AFTER TREATMENT**
